Judy O'Bannon and Lori Borgman Keynote Speakers at CFMC's 'Women in Control' Conference in October

Morgan County, Ind. – Former First Lady of Indiana Judy O'Bannon and newspaper columnist Lori Borgman are scheduled to speak at the first-ever "Women in Control: Financial Boot Camp for Women" conference on October 18. The conference is offered by the Community Foundation of Morgan County, Inc.

From 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., participants will experience a no-fault environment and learn from women experts about money, banking investments, budgeting, personal finances, philanthropy, retirement, and other self-management topics.

Mrs. O'Bannon will close the conference as the luncheon keynote speaker. She served as First Lady from 1997 to 2003. During her service, she promoted civic engagement across Indiana, which she continues today as host and producer of the WFYI public television series "Communities Building Community" as well as "Judy O'Bannon's Foreign Exchange."

Her inspiring resume in philanthropy has included serving in the areas of community development, art, and historic preservation. Mrs. O'Bannon is Chairman of The O'Bannon Publishing Company, which publishes the award-winning "Corydon Democrat" and "Clarion" newspapers.

The morning keynote speaker at the conference is also no stranger to Indiana. Lori Borgman is an Indianapolis resident and a family life columnist whose work is distributed to more than 300 newspapers throughout the United States and Canada, including the "Indianapolis Star."

Borgman is the author of three books including "I Was A Better Mother Before I Had Kids," "Pass the Faith, Please," and "All Stressed Up and No Place to Go."
